Information Source Formats (Types)

Important: use many different formats

	<p>They have been edited and published which makes this resource generally reliable. Eg. Books, periodicals (magazines such as Faces), newspapers, and reference materials such as encyclopedias (general and specific), atlases, maps, charts, etc</p>
	<p>Eg. Video and music recordings (CD, MP3, DVD, Blu-ray, MP3), movies, TV broadcasts, photos, clipart, posters, drawings, diagrams, graphs, etc.)</p>

careful about using online resources.

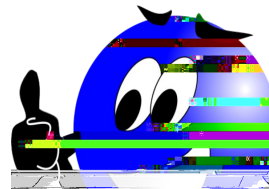





(Final Step to Research)
